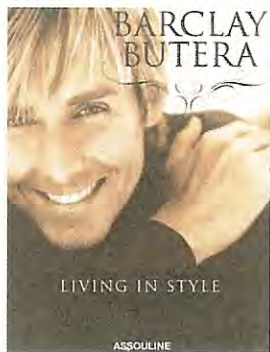

BARCLAY BUTERA: LIVING IN STYLE

"I am a fashion designer for the home," writes Los Angeles-based designer Barclay Butera in the introduction to his first book. He demonstrates this approach through residences in the book's five chapters: Beach, City, Desert, Mountain, and Town and Country. Each house documents a look—one crafted for contextual suitability and a place-centric lifestyle. Beach, naturally, is awash in blues and whites. Mountain, sensibly, peaks with craggy plaids and rugged, rusty terra tones. Town and Country, in contrast, is full of the stuff of suburban chic: "It represents lineage and heritage, family and friends, dogs and children, and it transcends the changing of the seasons."
